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

Ed Frawley's **Philosophy** on Dog Training

My philosophy of how to train dogs has been a journey that began when I was a boy in the 1950's and continues to this day. I get as excited today as I did 45 - 50 years ago when I learn something new about training my dogs.

For me this journey began as a hobby and has evolved into a life's passion and work. It will end on the day I die.

There is nothing secretive or magical about training dogs. Good dog training is all common sense combined with a foundation based on experience and a clear understanding of the way dogs think and interact (pack structure). The key is to get the right experience.

One only needs to spend a couple of hours searching the internet to understand that there are a lot of people out there who lack experience or who are basing their training opinions on poorly acquired experience. Dog training does not necessarily have to begin when you buy an 8 week old puppy (although it should) or when your 10 year old dog bites a child. In reality it begins on the day you make up your mind to learn how dogs think and how they relate to the world they live in. It begins when you decide to relate to your dog in a manner that both you and your dog respect and understand. It begins when you make up your mind to develop a meaningful relationship based on trust, communication and control.

Although my family had owned dogs my entire life I made this decision to really try and understand dogs when I was in high school. I was 16 years old and it was the 1960's. I owned a rescue dog named King and thought he was the cat's meow.

We took 2 or 3 walks in the woods every day. He was my best friend. I had him trained to hand signals and verbal commands. Once morning, before school, we came out of the woods and King chased a cat into the road. He would not respond to my calls to stop and COME. He ran in front of an Astin Martin sports car and was killed. To this day I can close my eyes and replay that event in slow motion.

That one incident forever changed the way I looked at dog training. It caused me to step back and make up my mind that the next time I would learn how to communicate in a way that my dog would listen in every scenario and not just in the ones he felt like.

I wrote this article with that thought in mind. I hope it may help other dog owners develop a new approach on how they relate to and train their dogs. I hope in some small way it makes you change your own philosophy of how to train your dog.

Three Categories of Dog Trainers

There are three basic categories of dog trainers which I place on a sliding scale.

The first category on the left is the group of people who beg or bribe and lure their dogs to do something by offering a food or toy reward. Don't get me wrong, I use food and toys in training, but I also use distractions and corrections. The people in this first category use neither.

All of the large pet food warehouses sponsor this category of ineffective training because they feel it is politically correct.

The problem with this group is that the dogs often choose not to do what's asked because they don't think the reward is high enough in value. These dogs end up being pushy, dominant and often antisocial aggressive animals. These are the dogs that are turned into animal shelters as being unmanageable when in fact they act the way they do as a result of ineffective dog training.

At the other end of the scale, on the right side, is the second category of dog trainers. These are trainers who intimidate or force their dogs to do what they want (the William Koehler trainers). I call them the old school "yank and crank" trainers.

They put a choke collar on a dog and force it to do everything. Most professional dog trainers use these methods because for them "time is money" and they can get a dog trained much quicker by forcing the dog to perform. The bottom line is with enough force a dog can be trained to do almost anything.

The problem with yank and crank trainers is the dogs seldom like their handlers. In fact softer dogs are often afraid of their handlers. These are the dogs that tuck their tails or lie on the ground when asked to do something. These are dogs that look nervous when they are near their owners. That's because they never know when the hammer is going to fall.

The problem with both categories of dog trainers is that their training produces inconsistent results along with dogs that don't like or respect their owners. You will never reach consistency in training if you don't have a good bond with your dog, or if your dog does not respect you as a pack leader.

The third category of dog trainer is the where I strive to be. Category three dog trainers want to be in the middle of the other two categories. They balance in the middle but are always prepared to move one way or the other depending on what's going on in their dog training at a given moment or point in time.

The third group uses motivational methods (food, toys or praise) to take a dog through a learning phase. The most effective motivational method is called training with markers. This is where the dog actually learns the meaning of a command – for example it learns the meaning of the word "COME."

Once the dog understands the meaning of the command the trainer then adds distractions to the program. A good example of this is a dog that has learned the meaning of the word "DOWN" but now must learn that "DOWN" means stay down until the handler gives a "RELEASE COMMAND." This means the dog must stay down even if the owner or someone else tosses a ball in front of the dog's feet or drops a hot dog 4 feet from where he is lying.

If a dog is disobedient under distraction or does not follow directions this third category of dog trainers teaches a dog that there will be correction for being disobedient. The key here is that corrections are never given unless the owner 100% knows the dog understands what is being asked of him but refuses to follow the command.

Dogs Can Love You but Not Respect You

New pet owners also fail to understand that dogs are pack animals. They have the same genetic driving force that wolves have to form and live in a "pack environment." Members of a pack seek a hierarchy within their family pack. Then genetically seek a ranking order.

Domestic dogs look at the family they live with as their family pack. If the humans don't become pack leaders their dogs will step up and assume the role. That's how dogs become dominant.

The majority of behavioral problems develop as a result of poor pack structure in the dog's living environment. This is why I tell people that obedience training is only 25% of the solution to correct behavioral problems and 75% deals with establishing a sound family pack structure.

Your dog can love you and not respect you. You can NEVER love your dog into respecting you. People who anthropomorphize their dogs (treat them as human children) find this out very quickly.

When referring to a canine relationship, love and respect are two unrelated emotions. Respect is gained through hard work, education and experience.

When my dog shows disrespect I increase the pressure I put on the dog. This means I work the dog harder and control his free time until he shows me the respect that a pack leader must have. Pack leaders control the lives of pack members in fair, firm and consistent ways.

Respect | Co-Operate | Try

I tell people my dog should respect me, cooperate and try to do what I ask. If I have that then I can train the dog to do almost anything. For me this is not just "good behavior" it is "expected behavior." There is a difference, a huge difference, between a dog that tries to follow directions and fails and a dog that refuses to follow a command. That's a very important concept that new trainers must work out in their head.

Many people own dogs that are disrespectful and behave badly. When these owners start to train their dogs and the dogs start to mind, the owners mistakenly think their dogs now respect them. These owners are often wrong.

Respect is earned; it develops over time and is the result of good leadership techniques. It's not uncommon for a dog to mind 80% of the time and still not respect its owner. When dogs like this are asked to do something they don't want to do and the handler pushes the point to try and force the dog to mind these dogs often become handler aggressive. Their owners find themselves scratching their heads wondering why and what went wrong. What went wrong was a lack of pack structure because a dog with solid pack structure is not going to be aggressive in the presence of its pack leader.

The opposite of this problem are people who ask rather than tell their dogs to do something. They act like they are begging their dog to mind. If you go to any beginner obedience training class you will see this happen again and again. The sad thing is that this attitude in dog training not only produces inconsistent behavior it produces behavioral problems which can also lead to aggression and a dangerous dog.

When owners learn to apply responsible pack structure techniques and they master the concepts of a learning phase, a distraction phase, a correction phase along with a maintenance phase they are on the road to being a pack leader.

Getting out and actually working with the dog will give people the experience needed to learn the levels of praise and correction that are required to get a dog to do what is wanted. Applying sound pack structure principles in your day to day lives will establish you and family members as higher pack members in your family pack.

Never forget that "most dogs prefer being followers." Most dogs don't want to be pack leaders. When a dog owner learns to control the lives of a pet they will become the pack leader that their dogs want them to be.

Marker training (sometimes called clicker training) is one of the most profound systems of training dogs that I have seen in my 50 years of owning, breeding and training working dogs. I had been training dogs for almost 45 years when I started to learn this system. I felt like a kid in a candy store when I saw how well it worked and the attitude of my dogs that were being trained with markers. The fact is I still feel like that when I see dogs work with markers.

It was not than many years ago (in 1990's) that I was pretty vocal about how stupid I thought clicker training was. Those comments were made from a position of ignorance and a lack of understanding. Simply put, I was dead wrong and I made those comments without knowing the details of how the system worked. The power of marker training lies in understanding and applying the details.





Dog training is a learned skill. The goal of this DVD is to introduce dog trainers to the details of training with markers. Trainers must understand the details of this system if they are to be successful. Once they grasp the concept and learn to apply it to their dog training they will create dogs that become problem solvers and dogs that love training. Once trainers learn how to apply the fundamentals of marker training the concept can be applied to any dog sport, including bite work.

Marker training can be started on 8 week old puppies or 6 year old dominant rescue dogs. It is a purely positive method of training dogs that is 100% non-confrontational. That is one of the reasons it can work with dominant dogs. This system goes a long way towards building or repairing the bond between handler and dog.

While I sincerely believe that training dogs with the motivational methods of marker training is the best way to train a dog, I also believe that this work needs to be balanced by introducing corrections into the more advanced training. Purists would argue this point but in my DVD I discuss when and how certain dogs need corrections.

Since the early 1900's dog training has been an evolving skill. We only need to look back to the 1970's and the methods of William Kholer or Winifred Strickland to see how far dog training has improved is the last 25 years. In my opinion no one is ever going to reinvent a better way to train dogs than with markers. The only thing that we will see change will be people who do a better job of applying this method of dog training.

If you have trained dogs for years and think you are pretty good but you do not work with the marker system, I suggest you take a few days and study this DVD. You too may find a whole new method of K9 communication and it may re-ignite a fire in your belly to get out and train.

The foundation of Michael's dog training system lies in marker training. The power of Michael's system lies in how markers are applied within his training program. Unlike trainers who claim they can train every dog with 100% positive motivational methods, we know for a fact that corrections should have a place in any serious dog training program. They are required to guarantee reliability under distractions.

The beauty of Michael's system is that it establishes a method of communication with our dogs that is built on positive reinforcement. It is a communication system that is "black and white" to our dogs. This work builds a non-confrontational relationship with a dog. Because it is nonconfrontational and based on positive reinforcement it is perfect for 8 week old puppies or 5 year old dominant and aggressive dogs. It is the perfect system to build or repair a relationship with a dog.

Our DVDs use untrained dogs and untrained handlers

The first two DVDs in this series (the second is How to Play Tug with Your Dog) covers the foundation of Michael's training system.

Both of these DVDs were produced with untrained dogs. Unlike other training videos where the training shown is only demonstrated with a trained dog - we chose to only use untrained dogs and untrained handlers.

I edited the training to show Michael demonstrating his training concept and I then fill the DVD with with examples of both untrained dogs and handlers learning the system. There is no question in my mind that people learn more from watching others make mistakes and then learning how to fix those mistakes.

Engagement:

Trainers often talk about how to establish focus with a dog. Michael calls this work "engagement." He makes the point that the quickest way to teach a dog exercises is to first train a dog to get and stay engaged with his handler in every environment.



MARKING - SHAPING - LINKING BEHAVIORS

Marker training is the most effective training system I have seen in my 50 plus years of training dogs. It's a black and white method of communication that is based on positive reinforcement.

Marker training provides the dog trainer a motivational method of telling his dog "the instant" his dog does something you like. It provides a non-punishment method of telling a dog "the instant" the dog does something you don't like and it provides a motivational method of telling a dog that you like what he is currently doing and you want him to continue to do exactly what he is doing at this moment in time.

If you stop and think about it, when you can do these three things and do them in a fashion that keeps your dog motivated and engaged with his handler then you can teach that dog to do almost anything.

Marker training (which is sometimes called "Clicker Training" can start with 8 week old puppies or 8 year old dominant aggressive dogs. The beauty of the system is that it's non confrontational, which is why it works so well with dominant aggressive animals or animals with absolutely no training, or animals that need to be retrained. Here at Leerburg we have trained our horses and our parrot with markers. The fact is marker training works on most types of animals and birds.

Marker training is the same thing as clicker training. The only difference is that

with markers we use a verbal markers and with clicker training a small mechanical clicker is used to communicate with the dog.

It's embarrassing to say this but back in the late 1990's I was one of a group of people who trash talked clicker training. This was based on my being too closed minded on the subject and a lack of understanding about the principles of the marker system. That wasn't the first time I stuck my foot in my mouth and it will most certainly not be the last.

The problem I had with clicker training back then was that clicker purists don't believe in correcting a dog. In fact they don't think corrections have a place in dog training. I totally disagree with this line of thinking and because of that I refused to look into what the marker system was really all about. I knew from experience that there are times when a pack leader has to correct his dog. I also knew (because of the kind of dogs that I trained - high drive tough dogs that were trained to do handler protection work) that there are also precise places and times in a training program where a dog has to experience a correction for disobedience (we will discuss this in detail later in this article).

With this said many of the people who brought clicker training to the world of dog training came from training sea mammals and birds. You can't correct a killer whale or a parrot when they disobey. It just doesn't work. These people thought they could apply the same exact training principles to dogs and they convinced a lot of new dog trainers that they were right. Well in my opinion they were wrong. When I began to see marker trained dogs that were energetic well trained animals who loved working with their handlers I started to explore exactly what marker training was all about. That's when I realized how foolish I had been to poo poo such a great training system.

Michael Ellis was the person who opened my eyes to the fact that markers and corrections can coexist together as part of a training program. The fact since the late 1990's Michael travels around the country giving 40 to 45 weekend seminars a year on his system of using markers in training. He recently opened a school in San Francisco CA for dog trainers (see page 63).

What I learned is the power of this system lies in understanding the details of the program. Dog handlers who master the system become the most successful dog trainers. The truth in this statement can be seen in videos of old dog competitions from back in the 1980's and 1990's. Handlers who won competitions back in then would not stand a chance of winning today. The reason for this is that today's top competitors train with markers.

I have been producing dog training videos since 1982. These three DVDs are the best dog training DVD I have done.

If you have trained dogs for years and think you're pretty good at it but you don't work with the marker system, I suggest you take a few days and study this article and these DVDs You will find a whole new world of K9 communication. If you are passionate about dog training (like I am) you will re-ignite a fire in your belly.

On the other hand if you do what I first did, which was tell everyone how stupid you think it is then 10 years from now you will probably wake up one morning and admit that you missed the boat.

So exactly what is Marker Training?

In technical terms marker training is operant conditioning. Operant conditioning has been around for years. It is how Dolphins are trained at sea world.

Operant conditioning forms an association between a behavior and a consequence. I can see new dog trainers reading this and shaking their heads thinking "Dahhhh isn't that pretty obvious and what all dog training is about?"

My answers to that is "YES," but let's go into a little more detail.

When a dog exhibits a behavior we like the consequence is a high value reward. In marker training that reward is either a high value food treat or a high value toy that the dog really loves. If a dog does not perform a behavior the consequence is "No Reward." This is called a negative reinforcer. When a dog gets a negative reinforcer it must then repeat the exercises if it wants to get the high value reward.

In old school dog training the consequence of a negative behavior was a correction.

No matter what anyone ever tells you dogs do things for themselves. Dogs don't do things to make you feel good. They do things to make themselves feel good. They do things because they are motivated towards feeling comfortable in addition to doing things that eliminate feeling discomfort. This is a pretty profound concept and one that pet owners often miss. Pet owners or new dog trainers are often lead to believe that dogs will eventually do things to make their owner feel good. The reality is that this is seldom if ever the case.

So the key to operant conditioning is to teach a dog that when he performs a behavior that we like he gets a reward that makes him feel good - the reward gives him a level of comfort. This reward can either be in the form of a food or it can be a toy he likes to play with or playing a game with the handler that he gets enjoyment out of or he gets praise from his handler (which he likes). In all my years of dog training I have only known one dog that would work strictly for handler praise.

In the marker training system there are only two consequences to a behavior that we are trying to train. They are a reward or no-reward. Which consequence happens depends on the behavior the dog exhibits to a stimulus. A stimulus can be a command or a cue (or lure) from the handler.

For dogs to associate a behavior with a reward or with punishment the reward or punishment must come immediately after the behavior. We tell people the consequence should come within a 1/2 second of the behavior. If a reward comes 5 seconds after a behavior the dog has no idea why he is getting a reward. If a new dog owner comes home and finds a pile of dog poop in his kitchen and he proceeds to rub the dog's nose in it. That dog does not have a clue why he is getting punished.

Now if the same dog has been on leash in the kitchen and peed on the floor and the handler had scolded him the instant he saw the dog pee, the dog would associate the scolding with peeing, because it came within 1/2 second of the behavior.

In training it is not always possible to reward within a 1/2 second. In fact no matter how hard you try you cannot consistently reward a dog within 1/2 second. The get around this we bridge (or connect) the time frame between the behavior and the consequence that follows. This bridge allows us to extend the 1/2 second rule of consequences. That bridge is a word - we will call it a Marker (I like to use the word YES, other people use other words). Many people use the sound from a clicker. The fact is you can use any word or sound you are comfortable with as long as you are consistent.

A simple way to look at the mark as a bridge is that it is like telling your dog "Hold on a second, I like what you just did and I am going to get to you and give you a high value reward."

There are positive and negative markers. The word for a negative Marker is "NO" or "NOPE." It is important to mention that a negative marker is not a correction. It is simply a way of communicating to the animal that he just made a mistake and if he expects to get that high value reward he needs to redo the behavior correctly. Through repetition the dog learns that every time he hears the positive Marker he gets a reward. Every time he hears the negative Marker he does not get a reward and he has to repeat the behavior or exercise.

Dogs that are trained with markers become problem solvers. They have learned (through the concept of negative reinforcement) that when one behavior doesn't work they need to try something else and if that doesn't work they just keep trying because if they try long enough they have a good chance of figuring out what you want and getting a high value reward.

The system allows trainers to reinforce correct behavior with "pin point accuracy" from a distance. It also allows dogs to make mistakes and then learn from their mistakes. The beauty of the system is that it also allows us to pin point the exact moment a dog makes a mistake, without correcting the dog in the process.

This is radically different from old school dog training where dogs are corrected for doing something wrong. I remember the day when we would take an untrained dog and march down the street with the dog on a leash. We would do a quick left turn, right turn or about turn as we said "HEEL" and give the dog a correction for not staying by our side. When I stop and think about it - how unjust was this to my dogs. It was a terrible way to train. It created dogs that were afraid to try and think on their feet because if they made a mistake they would get a correction.

Training with Markers is a simple concept to understand. It only takes a few minutes to explain why it works but it can take years to master. The journey is

exciting and well worth the trip. Along the way you will find that your dogs are a lot smarter than you once thought.

Those days are long gone with marker trainers.

The 5 Magic Words of Marker Training

The basic foundation of marker training involves teaching the dog the meaning of these 5 core words. Once the dog understands how these words are used to communicate with him they can be applied to every exercise you wish to train your dog.

Those words are:

I - **READY** or **ARE YOU READY?** - A word that tells our dog that we are about to start a training session. When you ask your dog if he is ready - you always have something on you to reward the dog with when he engages with you or starts to offer behaviors.

As your dog gains experience you should never start training unless the dog demonstrates he is ready to play when you take him out, we call this engagement. Getting engagement from a dog is a learned skill. We have an entire chapter in my Michael Ellis DVD that teaches how to get engagement and a second chapter on how to socialize a dog to environmental stressors.

If he won't play then handlers need to put the dog away and think about what they need to do to get the dog engaged the next time they bring him out.

The relationship between you and your dog is more important than training. So if your dog isn't engaged with you, if he doesn't feel like playing today then you should not try and teach him behaviors or exercises. Put him away or take him for a walk. An interesting thing that seems to happen when dogs are trained to understand engagement is they view their handler as their own personal treat dispenser. In their eyes they simply have to do this silly little exercise to make you give them a high value treat or a toy.

2- YES - the word we use as a positive marker. It's the word we use to bridge the time frame between a favorable behavior and us delivering a reward. Once the dog has been introduced to concept of "YES" (we call this CHARGE THE MARK) they quickly learn that EVERY TIME you say YES they know they are going to get the reward. With experience they learn that this can take 3 or 4 seconds if your not right next to them when you say YES.

It is important that trainers understand that "YES" is not verbal praise. Trainers new to markers commonly misunderstand the difference between a MARK and PRAISE. They need to learn that they can MARK THE MOMENT and then praise the dog with "GOOD BOY" after they mark.

When a trainer who gets excited says "YES, YES, YES YOU'RE A GOOD BOY," they only confuse the dog because in effect they are marking three moments in time. We will talk more of this later.

YES is also a word that is used as a release command when the dog does something correctly. This means "YES" not only tells the dog that what he just did was correct, it also tells the dog that he can stop doing what he doing and he is now free to interact with you (IE get his food reward or play tug or chase a toy etc).

3- GOOD - a word that means "I like what you are doing and I want you to continue to do what you are doing."

In other words GOOD is the word we use to add duration to a command. A perfect example would be to use GOOD when we are teaching the dog to STAY DOWN. When we teach duration for the down we would not mark the dog when he went down with a YES because the mark is the release. If we marked the down that would mean we just gave the dog permission to get up and get his reward. So new trainers need to understand that GOOD is not a release command. When we say GOOD the dog needs to understand that if he continues to do exactly what he was doing when we said GOOD he will get a reward at some point in the future.

Unlike training the mark, when we first start training duration we can say GOOD a number of times in a row. We can say GOOD, GOOD, GOOD as many times as we need to get the dog to continue to do what he is doing.

4- NOPE - a word that is used as a negative marker. It means you just made a mistake and you have to do the exercise all over again. It does not mean we are mad, it does not mean that he is going to get a correction, it only means that he needs to repeat what we expected him to do if he really wants the high value reward.

If the reward is high enough in value to the dog it doesn't take a dog long to figure out that NOPE means "DO IT AGAIN."

5- DONE or BREAK (as in "take a break") - is the word that tells the dog that our training session is finished for now. The session can be finished for 5 minutes or it can mean we are done for the day.

When we say DONE the food or toys are put away. When the handler says DONE or BREAK and shows his dog his empty hands it doesn't take long for the dog to know that this training session is over.

With time this becomes very clear to our dog.

The beauty of marker training is that we can clearly tell a dog by using READY that we are going to start training and with DONE we are finished with training. It becomes very clear to the dog when we expect him to work.

The rest of this article deals with the applications of these 5 core words.

Dogs are masters at reading body language

They are far more intuitive than we humans. They are always watching us and they instinctually recognize situations and read us like a book. They know when we are happy and they know when to leave us alone. They base ALL of their life's decisions on what reinforces their level of comfort and what satisfies their pack instincts.

New dog trainers mistakenly think their dogs listen to them all the time. They think the dog automatically knows when commands are given. The fact is that dogs may listen but they don't naturally pick up on our every word. In fact trained dogs don't understand much of what we say. But they are very intuitive about reading and recognizing specific situations or pictures (of our body language). They are so good at this that we think they know what we are saying when in fact they don't have a clue.

A perfect example of this is a dog that learns to sit in your kitchen. The dog can perform the sit exercise 200 times in the kitchen and you may think he has that concept of the SIT command down pat. Then you take him in your garage and say SIT and he looks at you like you are the man in the moon talking Swahili. He acts like you have two heads and he has never heard the word SIT before.

A better example is when the dog has always been given the SIT command when you are standing in front of him in the kitchen. Simply turning your back and saying SIT results in a blank stair, or kneeling down or sitting on the floor and saying SIT gets no results.

That is because the dog does not understand the concept of SIT. He doesn't know what you are asking him to do. Oh you may think he knows the word SIT but what he really knows is that when he sees the picture of you standing in front of him in the kitchen he should SIT.

So when you see a dog do this you need to know that your dog has not yet grasped the concept of the SIT command.

Marker training is going to teach you how to communicate with your dog so they grasp the concepts of the commands you wish to train them and its going to do this is a way the dog enjoys.

Active vs. Reactive Dogs

Marker training turns a dog into what we call an "Active Dog" vs. a "Reactive Dog." This means the system creates a dog that actively tries to problem solve. These dogs try to engage their handlers by trying to do things that make their handlers play with them, give them a food or toy reward or ask them to do something that will lead to these two things.

Active dogs try to make things happen. They know they can do things that cause their owner to engage them. In essence they themselves become engaged with their handlers by bouncing around and trying to do things that result in their handler giving them a reward. As I have said earlier in this article, trainers need to learn how to teach engagement to their dog. Many new trainers simply think they have the wrong dog and their dogs won't act like this. These people are wrong. They simply need to learn how to provide an environment that makes the dog want to engage the handler.

This is compared to a reactive dog that waits to be shown what the handler wants. Reactive dog are afraid to try new things for fear they will be corrected for making mistakes.

Every time you take your dog out you are teaching the dog something. You may not know what it is but our dogs are constantly watching and evaluating us. An active dog is trying to figure out how to interact with you in a way that benefits him. A reactive dog is trying not to step on land mines that result in his getting a correction. Marker training is the perfect method to produce an active dog.

We can use a ball reward to demonstrate the difference between active and reactive dogs.

An active dog will go out on the training field and engage his owner. He will focus on the owner and offer behaviors that he thinks may cause his owner to produce the ball. This is a dog that bounces around and willingly gives eye contact, lays down, sits up, goes into the heel position without being asked to do any of those things. He does this until the owner produces the ball and asks him to d something he has been trained to do.

A reactive dog is a dog that goes to the training field and waits for the owner to ask him to do something. He doesn't offer any behaviors. He will perform a behavior and accept the ball as a reward but he isn't going to try and second guess what his owner wants him to do. In other words, he reacts to what the handler asks.

Reactive dogs have learned that if they try and figure out what their handlers want and they make a mistake - they get corrected. So they quit trying. They back off and take the safe approach, which is "wait until he tells me what he wants because I don't need another correction."

The first step is called Charging the Mark

The first step in training markers is to study the system. Know where you are going and understand the details of how you're going to get there. In other words study the details of how the marker system works.

We start teaching this system by showing our dog that every time "YES" or every time they hear a click from a clicker they get a really high value food treat. The system starts with food and not toys. The reason we start with food is that many high drive dogs can't focus in the presence of a toy. They go into a zone where they can't think. This doesn't happen with food. So we set the foundation of markers with food and once that's done we introduce the dog to the work for to rewards.

The first training step is called CHARGING THE MARK. It can be done anywhere, in your kitchen, your basement, or your back yard. The goal of charging the mark is to teach the dog to associate hearing YES with knowing he is going to get a high value reward.

When we start charge the mark training the dog does not have to do anything to get marked. We simply say YES or click the clicker and give the dog a food treat. He doesn't have to sit, he doesn't have to come to us, and he doesn't have to do anything. We just say YES and feed the dog, YES and feed the dog.

New trainers need to understand that the only dog training going on during CHARGE THE MARK is to make the dog realize that saying YES means "my handler is going to give me a really good food treat."

There are handler responsibilities in CHARGING THE MARK. It is important that the word YES is never said at the same instant you move your arm to reach for the food treat. For this program to work there must be short time lapse in time between saying the word YES and moving the arm to produce the food reward.

You will know your dog is getting it when you say YES and the dog looks at you like HEY, GIVE ME THAT TREAT!!! Most dogs pick up the concept of a CHARGED YES or CHARGE THE CLICK in the first training session. If you go out and say YES to a dog 30 to 50 times in a row he is going to connect the dots.

What kinds of Food Rewards to use

The first goal for the handler in marker training is to figure out what their dog considers a high value food reward. Different dogs have different ideas of what treats they like the best. To get the most out of marker training handlers need to determine what trips their dogs trigger.

I will guarantee you that going to WalMart and buying a bag of biscuits is not going to cut it.

There are a couple of important points about treats.

Treats should be large enough to motivate your dog to want another one and small enough that the dog does not take minutes to eat.

I used to say that 2 or 3 treats should fit on a quarter. I have since learned that there is such a thing as too small of a training treat for some dogs. If a dog eats a treat so quickly that it seems like he is inhaling the food and he then loses focus and checks out, then the handler may want to increase the size of the food treat. In other words a slightly larger treat may be a high value for that dog to result in him staying focused for a longer period of time. This is graphically demonstrated in my DVD on The Power of Training Dogs with Food.

The concept of using treats is not to "feed the dog" but rather to offer a reward that has a high enough value that it keeps the dog engaged. When treats are so large they slow down the training because we have to wait for the dogs to chew them up we need to reduce the size or change the treat. I also have a classic example of this in my DVD on food.

The best treats are soft and don't break up into pieces that fall on the floor. When the handler picks a reward that the dog loves it will stay engaged. This leaves the dog wanting more so his drive stays high. This is where to start the training and then see if you need to modify the size for your specific dog.

We sell a lot of all-natural dog treats here at Leerburg. More and more companies have become aware of the fact that people want quality treats for their dogs. In our case if our dogs don't like them we don't sell them. I like the Soft Training Treats and the Zuke's Mini Natural treats. They both come in different flavors, they are soft and they are the right size for our dogs.

Trainers may want to take the time to establish and prioritize a list of dog treats that their dogs really love. You may find that your dog becomes too distracted by the highest value treat. Some dogs can lose focus (just like some dogs lose focus in the face of a tug reward) and they can't think. If that happens you need to drop down to a lesser value treat in training.

When you move your training into an area where there are a lot of distractions you can go back to the highest value treat because the distractions will offset one another. This is an example of how trainers need to constantly think about what they are doing in their work and be willing to adjust to fit the circumstances.

There is also not anything wrong with using different levels of treats in a training session. Use a higher value treat reward for a really good or really quick effort and a lower value reward for a so so effort.

Ask Your Dog What Treats He Likes

You can ask your dog to tell you what treats he likes more than others. Back tie the dog (tie him to a post). Let him smell a treat - hold it out close to his nose but don't let him have it. Allow him to watch you lay it on the ground just out of his reach.

Do this with two treats and then release the dog. See which one he eats first. Then repeat the exercise several times and reverse the position of the treats. This will tell you if the dog indeed likes one treat over the other. Try adding a third treat to the protocol. With work you will be able to assign values to respective rewards.

By knowing which treat is his favorite you can use this information in later training. Some training requires the highest level motivation than others and some things only needs the level 4 treat.

Food Rewards vs. Toy or Tug Rewards

Just as there are times when a food reward is the correct type of reward there are times a toy or tug is a better choice. Knowing when to employ both will make you a better trainer.

Many high prey drive dogs become over stimulated when they know a toy is the reward. They actually go into too much drive. These dogs have so much drive for a toy that their brain shuts down and they can't focus when they see their handler with a toy.

New trainers mistakenly think the more drive the better. In fact this is often not the case.

Before a toy can be used for a reward the trainer needs to take his dog through a training process that teaches the dog three things:

- I- It teaches the dog to engage the toy with vigor and the only fun about a toy is when he is playing with his handler. In other words we teach the dog not to self reward into a toy.
- 2-The training teaches the dog to OUT (or drop the toy) when told to OUT. When you stop and think about it if you have to fight with your dog or use undo amounts of pressure to get the dog to release a toy then you lose the value of the toy as a reward because the dog is thinking about the argument your about to have to get the toy from him and not about what you just gave him the toy for.
- 3-The foundation training teaches the dog to bring the toy back to the handler when it is released. If a trainer does not have this established then we can only do one rep if the dog jerks the toy out of the handler's hand.

The training to do these three things along with how to play tug with your dog will be covered in the second training DVD with Michael Ellis, Th Power of Playing Tug with Your Dog.

Many trainers will teach an exercise with a food reward and then switch to a tug or toy reward to increase speed in the exercise.

Toys are also used to teach a dog Stimulus Control (which is talked about later).

Don't Confuse Your Dog - Only Say "YES" One Time

The reason you should only say YES one time is because dogs see life as a series of pictures or snap shots. Remember how intuitive our dogs are, they know exactly what they were doing at the exact moment good things happen to them.

When a dog looks into your eyes and you mark that moment by saying YES followed by a high value food treat they quickly figure out the trigger to get you to give them another treat is to look into your eyes.

But when trainers get excited and say YES 4 or 5 times in a row they confuse their dog. The dog doesn't know if they got rewarded for looking in your eyes or if the reward came from lowering their head to look at you hand or for something else.

Often times new trainers mistakenly look at the YES as praise. This is absolutely wrong. Once the dog understands the system the mark will often become secondary praise but that will only happen if the trainer establishes the foundation of the mark correctly by only saying YES once and always with good timing.

It is vitally important to understand the essence of marker training is to start with no obedience command and then only give the mark one time followed by a short pause before you give the dog a food treat.

A couple of points to mention here is that when the Mark has been properly established it will eventually become a secondary reinforce for the dog. This means the dog will eventually develop a level of satisfaction from you simply saying the word "YES," but at the same time you will never get to the point where you expect the mark to be the only reward. Every time you ever mark a behavior you will always offer a reward for that behavior.

"No Mark" is Valuable Information for Your Dog

Another concept to remember is that your dog will learn that "NO MARK" is information. By that I mean when you don't offer a mark you are telling the dog that he has not yet performed the behavior you want. This is not a negative response on you part, it is simply a non-stressful way to tell your dog that he needs to "keep trying."

The goal of this video is to teach people how to train their own dog to become a well mannered family pet. Our DVD was last updated in early 2007. It was originally produced in 1982 and has gone through a number of updates. With each release, it gets better and better.

The problem with taking your dog to obedience class is that the dog is expected to learn new commands under extreme distraction (i.e. when it is surrounded by 10 or 20 other dogs). This is not the correct way to train a dog. In fact, it's totally unfair to the dog.

There are four phases to dog training:

- I.The Learning Phase
- 2. The Correction Phase
- 3. The Proofing Phase
- 4. The Maintenance Phase

In the learning phase new commands should be introduced in a distraction free environment; like your kitchen or your back yard or an environment that the dog is used to living in.

We teach new commands through positive motivation. During this phase we never correct the dog for not performing the command. It would be unfair to give a correction during this phase because the dog has not yet learned the meaning of the command.

When the dog has learned a command but then refuses to do it, it is time to move into the correction phase of training. This is where the dog learns that if it does not do what it is told to do, it will get a correction. Every dog is different; our video shows how to determine when to give corrections and what level of correction to give different dogs.

When the dog consistently performs obedience commands at home, it is ready for the distraction or proofing stage of training. During this phase we teach the dog that it must mind no matter where it is or what is going on around it. This means it must follow your commands when people come to your house, when other dogs are around, when on a walk, or when playing with toys.

Dog training never ends. It is in the maintenance phase of training that our dogs learn that we are always constant in our expectations. We show him



that we always expect him to follow our commands.

Our DVD will teach you how to train the basic commands of Sit, Down, Come, Stay, Heel, and go to your place.

I do not recommend organized obedience classes until a dog reaches the distraction phase of its training. By this point obedience classes are fun. How else could you get 20 friends and their dogs together to help proof your dog's obedience commands?

There are 3 concepts in dog training that new trainers must understand before they begin to work with their dog:

- I. How to break a command down into small component parts that your dog can understand.
- 2. How to effectively praise your dog. This video will teach you how and when to praise. You will learn what happens when you praise too much or to little.
- 3. How to administer a proper correction for your dog's temperament. You also will learn when to correct, and just as important, when not to correct your dog. I also explain what to do when you make a mistake and correct too hard, or what to do when you correct at the wrong time.

The training concepts in this video are broken down into step by step increments that even young children can understand.

We strongly recommend people establish pack structure before they begin formal obedience training. If you are a new dog owner your goal should be to create a calm submissive dog. The road to accomplishing this is explained in our DVD titled ESTABLISHING PACK STRUCTURE WITH THE FAMILY DOG. That' is why we recommend that new dogs owners get both Basic Obedience and our Establishing Pack Structure DVD.

New pet owners are often told the road to a calm, submissive dog is to attend obedience classes and socialize their dog. We don't agree with this, in fact we think it's bad information.

All dogs are pack animals. Every breed of dog is hard wired with genetic pack instincts. The smallest Chihuahua to the largest Great Dane wants to live in a dog pack. They also genetically want to establish leadership and rank within their pack.

The road to a calm submissive dog is to first establish pack structure and leadership. Once leadership has been determined a dog can then be obedience trained.

I get hundreds of emails every week from people who have behavioral problems with their dogs. 99% of these problems are a direct result of owners who have failed to establish pack structure with their dogs.

Establishing pack structure means teaching the dog that he now lives in your family pack and that you are his pack leader. This process also teaches the dog that YOU set rules that he must live by. Once a dog accepts your leadership and your rules he becomes a calm, happy dog.

When a dog accepts a pack leader he is also more willing to listen and follow directions during obedience training.

This DVD will teach the way I establish pack structure with a new dog when I bring it into my home. The goal of my training is to establish leadership and still allow the dog to maintain his dignity. When I introduce my rules I do so in ways that create a level of communication and respect.

The information I show is based on my 45 years of experience in training, breeding over 350 litters of German Shepherds, competing in various sports, and working as a police K-9 handler for 10 years. I've established leadership with more dangerous dogs than I can remember. During this work I have never been badly bitten or even hurt by a dog.

I like to remind people that hundreds of thousands of dogs with behavioral problems go through obedience classes every year in this country. The vast majority of these dogs come out of class with the exact same problem they had when they started training. The reason for this is that most obedience classes teach exercises (i.e. come, sit, stay, and down) and they ignore pack structure training.

Teaching obedience first puts the cart before the horse. Once a respectful relationship has been established you have an atmosphere of trust and respect that provides a platform to start obedience training.

The reason we have so many humane societies full of dogs, so many dog bites, so many behavioral problems, and so many dog fights is because owners have not established pack structure and leadership.

The bottom line in all of this work is that in essence you are going to learn to speak and live "DOG." You are not teaching the dog anything he does not already know. All you are doing is showing the dog that you understand his language and expect him to respect you and live by your rules.

When we establish a meaningful bond with our dog we will both wake up everyday wanting to spend time together. Do not ever underestimate the happiness this kind of relationship can bring to your life.

How to Raise a Working Puppy

There is a big difference between how one should raise a working puppy and how pet owners raise their pets. Working puppies are expected to look at their world with more self confidence. It does not make any difference if you are raising a Schutzhund puppy, a police service dog puppy, a puppy for personal protection work, or a puppy for competition obedience or agility. They can all benefit by making some simple changes in how they are brought up and handled.

This is not a bite training video. It is a video teaching people how we raise our personal pups here at Leerburg. In this video we outline in a step-by-step manner how to socialize, imprint, and prepare your puppy for his or her working career. This is a common sense approach that anyone can do. The key to raising a successful working puppy is to have a plan and make the best use of the time you spend with your dog. An example of this is: one can take their pup for a walk and have it just be exercised; or one can take their pup for a walk and make it an experience in which the pup gets exercise, along with a chance to learn MARKERS and be introduced to environments that provide a small level of stress for the pup to learn to work through.

This dog training DVD deals with the following topics:

- I. Should the working pup be a house dog or a kennel dog?
- 2. Manage and neutralize a working pup to training collars.
- 3. Teaching a working puppy that a vehicle is going to be a big part of its working career.
- 4. Learning to be neutral to other dogs.
- 5. Socializing, or "neutralize," our pups to strange environments.
- 6. One of the differences between a pet and a working puppy is that we are not as concerned with the manners of a working puppy. With that said, there are certain manners that we do consider important and we start work on them at a very early age.
- 7. It is very common for new trainers to over exercise their puppy. We cannot tell anyone exactly how much to exercise their pup, but we do talk about some of the guidelines that we take into consideration.
- 8. We have a section in the DVD on medical issues and a working puppy. It is a given that a working puppy is going to be exposed to more examinations by a stranger (a Vet) than the average dog. We believe that a little forethought at an early age goes a long way towards eliminating a dog getting stressed over this as an adult.
- 9. Games and toys.

10. If you are raising a working puppy you are probably going to have a dog with a degree of drive. While this video does not show how to bring out that drive (my video Building Drive and Focus does that) - we do caution people that "JUST BECAUSE YOUR PUP CAN DO SOMETHING DOES NOT MEAN IT SHOULD DO SOMETHING."

When used properly low level stimulation from a remote collar is one of the most humane methods ever developed to train dogs. I call it training with an invisible leash. There is a myth that stimulation from an e-collar involves pain. This is simply not true. The majority of the time the levels we use in training cause a sensation that gets the dogs attention but they do not involve any pain.

There are a number of old school theories of how to train with a remote collar. I explain these methods in my DVD and then tell you why the methods I offer are the best I have seen in 27 years of remote collar training.

The goal of all dog training is to teach our dog to follow a voice command. My training methods teach a dog that the stimulation from an e-collar comes from the owner and only after the dog refuses a known command.

The goal of this video is to train a dog in muzzle to alert on a passive suspect located some distance from his handler. If that suspect tries to fight or flee, the dog is to physically fight the man by punching him center mass with his body. Training a dog to indicate on a suspect that is running away from him, stimulating him, or a gitating him is easy. Training a dog to indicate on a man standing still, or a man laying quietly on the ground is another matter all together.

Training a police dog the bark & hold (B&H) is very different from training a sport dog the B&H. Most service dogs come from the ranks of sport dogs. They must quickly change their view of the helper from someone that is a prey object, to someone who is a fighting partner. Trainers do not have months to accomplish this, in most cases it must be done in weeks.

This requires different training methods and a different attitude toward barking. No longer does the dog sit closely to the helper barking in a challenging manner, hoping to make the helper flee so he can get a bite. Rather, the dog stands back 2 or 3 meters (because he realizes the suspect can hurt him) and he barks to notify his handler that he has found the suspect.

A police dog must now view the helper as a fighting partner and not the motor behind his prey item or his sleeve. The bark and hold for a police dog must come from fight drive. Dogs that work in fight drive rather than prey drive are a lot easier for the handlers to control. This video shows how to get a serious bark and hold out of a genetically correct dog. The video is a must for every K-9 handler and sport trainer that wants to train a more serious dog.



The DVD I produced on hard surface tracking was done in Holland at Nuspeed and Rotterdam. The design for these boxes was first shown in these DVD's.

This designed has been successfully used by many trainers here in America. It is an excellent training tool that can be used to proof dogs off of odors in addition to locking dogs onto odors.

The best application for these boxes is to

have 5 to 7 boxes hung on walls or on 2x4 racks that you mount in a room. These boxes can also be used to train accelerant dogs.

Bite Training Puppies

There are areas of dog training, whether it be Police Service work, KNPV, Schutzhund, Personal Protection, or the Ring Sports, that require a dog to learn to bite people. By selecting the right pup and then imprinting as much bite work as possible at an early age, we end up with a much better adult.

The first 45 minutes of this video deals with the instincts and drives to look for in selecting a puppy for protection training. We show puppy tests that explain how to select the right pup from a litter. This video was filmed in Germany and America over a 5 year period. We filmed a German litter being tested and then went back two years later and filmed one of these dogs just before it got a SchH III.


All of this training is done by the handler. I compare this to a father teaching his child to fight. A father can teach his child the basic skills of judo or karate and it is all done in the framework of being a game. It is the same thing with the handler working his own pup in prey drive. This video explains the information needed to teach a puppy the basic skills of bite work.

While this training is the foundation for protection or attack work, the pups are not capable of doing serious handler protection until they are mentally mature enough to deal with the stress of a real encounter. Most dogs are not mentally mature until they are 18 to 30 months old.

Our video shows how to take a young dog through the steps of defensive training. This is an extremely critical phase of a dog's training career. The reason for this is that there is a fine line between a dog defending itself, and the fight or flight response. In protection training we never want to push a dog into avoidance.

For years people in this country have only trained dogs in prey drive. In fact, even today many dogs are still trained only in prey drive. This is a serious mistake if the handler ever expects that dog to do any form of personal protection. Dogs trained only in prey do not protect their handlers.

The helper work for defense can never be done by the dog's owner. It must always be done by a helper that is adept at reading and understanding the drives and temperament of defense. If you are training a new helper, we recommend that your helper watch and learn from the video. The information we cover is as important for the helper as it is for the dog.

If you are a K9 officer who trains your service dog with food and a ball you already know that you only catch 3 or 4% of the people you track. The RCMP (Royal Canadian Mounted Police) catch 45-50% of all the people they track. This includes suburban and urban tracking. If a suspect runs in the country, they catch 95% of them.

This video was filmed in Alberta, Canada at the police dog training center for the RCMP. RCMP instructors are the best tracking dog instructors in the world. They have been training police tracking dogs since 1935. This video will show how the RCMP can train a dog (in 60 training tracks) to follow a I hour old, 5 KM, unknown track that contains back tracks, road crossings, fence crossings, and articles. The RCMP has 3 levels of tracking. This video covers Level One, or tracking in a rural environment. Level Two and Three (#208-D) deals with suburban and urban tracking.

Training Urban & Suburban Tracking Dogs

This video was also done with the RCMP in Canada. In it we train a dog to track in a suburban and urban environment. In Level One Tracking (Video 205) we taught the dog to track in the country. The reason all police dogs must first learn to track in the country is because the country is relatively distraction free. We actually teach the dog to track in the country and then use a portion of the Level Two & Three to teach the dog to deal with the distractions of the city.

In this video the dogs learn to deal with extreme distractions: dogs barking on the other side of a fence, cats in back yards, and kids following along. The dogs also learn to deal with much smaller scent pictures, more cross tracks, and extreme cover changes.

Most people think that handling a tracking dog simply means holding on to the line and just following the dog. In fact, completing a successful track is 75% proper handling and 25% good dog work.

I call prong collars "Power Steering for Dogs." It is probably the most misunderstood training tool there is. So many people take one look at it and say "Oh! I could NEVER use that on MY dog!" Then when I explain how it's used and why it's used they call back and say "ED, THIS IS THE GREATEST THING!" When a prong collar is used in training, the handler must realize that a dog who required a level 8 correction before will probably require a level 2 or 3 correction with a prong. So a strong dog with too much drive for a small person to handle is now easily controllable without a lot of effort. If you are a new Schutzhund trainer or a police service dog handler, you will need a prong collar. The advantage of the quick release is the use of the clamp to open and close versus opening a link to remove or put on the collar. I train dogs with prong collars. There are very few dogs that I would not train with a prong collar. I recommend them to new dog owners, new trainers and people who own dogs with behavioral problems. While some think a prong looks nasty the fact is they are far more humane than a normal choke collar.

The biggest problem with prong collars is that new dog owners don't know how to put them on, how to size them, or how to have their dog wear them. This article will address these issues.

Normal choke collars need to be ordered by length (i.e. 22 inches long etc.) Prong collars on the other hand are ordered by weight: extra heavy, heavy, light, etc. They all come in a standard length which is adjusted to fit the neck of the dog by removing or adding links to the collar.

Prong collars are meant to be put on and taken off before and after daily training sessions. Unlike a choke collar that is often left on the dog all the time (in some cases this can be a dangerous practice).

A common problem new trainers have is they don't remove enough links to get the correct snug fit. When that happens the collar hangs down on the dogs neck which results in the collar not working the way that it was designed.

This photo below demonstrates a prong collar that was not properly sized for the dog. The collar is too loose and riding too far down on the dog's neck. It should be up where I have drawn the yellow line.



The correct position for a prong collar is to sit right behind the dog's ears and up under the jaw line. This is shown in the photo below.

A perfect safety procedure to use along with a prong collar is a dominant dog collar. I offer this advise to ALL those trainers who use prong collars.



When you use your prong collar, we strongly recommend you use a Leerburg® Dominant Dog Collar as a safety backup. Prong collars can come apart. If a leash is clipped to a Leerburg® Dominant Dog Collar along with the prong collar, you will have control of the dog in the rare occurrence that the collar fails.

It is not unheard of for a mistake to happen and a prong collar comes apart when you need it the most. By having a dominant dog collar on the dog at the same time as the prong this will never be a problem. Simply attach the clip on the leash to both the prong and the ring on the dominant dog collar. This is shown in the photo below.



Dominant Dog Collars vs. Muzzles



Many times people make the decision to use a muzzle on a dog when in fact they should be using a dominant dog collar and a muzzle or in some cases just a dominant dog collar. Muzzles often just cover a dog's problems and do nothing to solve an aggression problem. These people need to learn the difference.

Our dominant dog collars are designed specifically to deal with handler aggressive or dog aggressive dogs. If you have a problem with aggressive or dominant dogs I would recommend that you go to my article section and read what I have written about Dominant and Aggressive dogs at: leerburg.com/articles.htm. More dogs are put to sleep every day for aggression problems than I care to think about. I am the first to agree that some dogs are beyond saving, but many of these dogs could have been retrained and saved. Killing a dog should ALWAYS be a last resort. Using these collars can and will make the difference between having to put a dog down or ending up with a dog the owner can live with.
